Grounds Committee Report

Rose Garden

Since the Rose Garden was successfully 'rescued' in August 2017, we have been focussing on maintaining its development (e.g. weeding, staking, pruning etc) and keeping the plants alive and healthy. This has been through a combination of the Ground Committee (and a few of their family and friends) efforts and through the use of an external company (North Shore Gardening and Maintenance).

Next Working Bee

We normally run a working bee late in T2 or in early T3. We usually (but not always) work on the Rose Garden and/or distribute mulch around the playground. However, the Rose Garden (aside from some weeding) is in pretty good shape and we are not sure, with the re-development, whether we'll need more mulch in the playgrounds.

We have put a request into the school (via Margaret Charlton) to see if they had any tasks or issues they would like us to address. Depending on that outcome we would look to schedule a working bee at the appropriate time.

Financials

Money spent so far - out of the \$3k annual budget. Approximately \$600 – mainly for the use of North Shore Gardening and Maintenance services in the Rose Garden.
